
On or about November 1, 2011, HAWC will move its medical care services to the Community Center. We spoke with HAWC's CEO Dan Ahearn about this transition, "HAWC has been providing primary medical care at its current location, 476 North "B" street, for the past two years. The new Community Center is a much more convenient and spacious location to serve our patients. Our phone number will remain the same (775) 284-3570. Starting shortly after the New Year of 2012 we will have a medical provider available Monday thru Friday. It is our hope and vision that in the not too distant future we will be able to provide oral health care for the region."

We look forward to welcoming HAWC staff and patients to the Community Center with a celebration in the coming months. We will keep you posted as soon as more information is available.
